Tayla won many events in the interschool athletics competition held earlier this year and consequently was selected to represent the Central Region in Darwin. While she performed strongly in her heats (100m, 200m, long jump and 4×100 m relay) she did not win any of her individual events. However, her team did come second in the 4×100 m relay. As we gather, we acknowledge the Arrernte people who are those appointed by God as the traditional custodians of this land — both within the area called Mparntwe, which we now know as Alice Springs, and widely across this country we now call Australia.

We pay our respect to Elders, past and present, for the way they have stewarded the Lord's good creation. We extend that respect to all Indigenous people past and present, and those future generations – who we pray will continue this task, trusting that our creator will continue reconciling all things to himself in Jesus Christ.

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This term we have been studying Algebra in Year 9 Maths. Algebra is a way of modelling an aspect of God's rich creation so that we can make predictions without having to constantly verify the prediction experimentally. For example, Newton's Law of motion (Force = Mass x Acceleration or F=ma), is an example of an algebraic expression that has its use in the acceleration of vehicles. Springs are a vital part of kitchen scales and so we asked the question; 'Can a rubber band be used to make a weighing device?' If there is a linear relationship between the stretch of the rubber band (S) and the weight of the object (W) attached to the rubber band, then the answer is Yes!

So as a class we designed an apparatus to measure the stretch (S) of a rubber band with varying weights (W) attached to it. We used empty sealable drink bottles to hold different weights. We started with a combined weight (bottles plus water) of 200g and measured the stretch 3 times. We then added a 100g of water to the system and measured the stretch for 300g. This was continued for weights of 400, 500 and 600g. The information was plotted on a graph and an equation was derived for the line of best fit. Our results suggested $S(cm) = 0.01105 \ W(g) - 1.32$

Students were then asked to use the graph to determine the stretch for 250g and to verify this experimentally. Students were also asked to think about the limitations of such an equation. In our society, mathematical equations are often seen as providers of truth. Our equation can be used to calculate the stretch for 20,000g but at this weight, the rubber band will break. We can also use the equation to calculate the stretch for a negative weight (this does not exist) leading to a meaningless answer. In this way, students came to understand that mathematical equations are valuable but any calculated values they provide, need to be evaluated to see if they make 'sense' in the reality that we experience.
